From the Chief Constable, Cumberland, Westmorland & Carlisle Constabulary

I have read with considerable interest a police report which I have received regarding the arrangements made for the search for the girl who was reported missing on the night of 2nd Jan, whilst climbing on Bowfell.

I am aware that a large number of rescue teams were involved in carrying out a very ex tensive search under extremely dangerous and trying conditions. The fact that Miss Howcroft was dead when she was found, in no way lessons the efforts of everyone concerned in this operation.

In view of the extremely large number of individual members and other voluntary helpers it would be impracticable for me to write to them all expressing my sincere appreciation and thanks, but in writing this letter to you, I shall be very glad if you will being this to the notice of as many people as possible
