# Management Committee Meeting 5th Sep 1974.

The Management Commitee hoped that experienced and regular weekenders will continue to make welcome all new Graduate Members. Correspondence was read to the effect that some new members felt a bit out of things sometimes.

The Subscription Secretary asked that a reminder be printed in the Bulletin to all Members who have not yet paid their subs this year. They are now long overdue, the annual subscription is now £3.

Whittle. D. King. Arising from the correspondance the Committee have asked that the following be printed in the Bulletin. From the Minutes of the Meeting held on the 11th July 1974.

"A lengthy discussion on Club income was resolved by a proposal that visiting clubs could use the hut (Langdale) at weekends in the Winter months - one Club per month (max 15 people) 5 women, 10 men or 15 men, and that parties would be allowed mid-week through the year except for holiday periods - 20 per party. The proposal was carried but the Secretary asked that his objection to mid-week bookings be recorded. The mid-week bookings would be tried for a period of 12 months!

The lease for Dunmail is still being negotiated but bookings are still being taken, ie. children/parties.

The Committee is still negotiating the lease on Buckbarrow (present rent £150 per annum. Proposed rent £300 per annum) Members are encouraged to use Buckbarrow more often in order to off-set this increase in rent.

The Committee thanked Matt Bennet for his stewardship of Bishop's Scale and applications are now invited for the vacant position of Hut Warden for Bishop's Scale.

Hut Fees from the 1st October 1974 will be as follows; Members 25p, Guests 50p.

There are now 99 Junior Members of the A.R.C.C. Members who have not yet applied for Junior Membership for their children are reminded of the 1st November 1974 deadline. Forms can be obtained from the Sec. please enclose a s.a.e.

The Parents or the child can apply for Full Membership status of the A.R.C.C. when in their 17th year ie. 16+. and Junior Members can use hut facilities when in their 17th year unaccompanied, as they are then to be regared as Graduate Members.

The last Sponsored Walk raised £1408.61. This was ditributed between three Lakeland Parishes.

Bishop Pearson has so far raised £7,000 towards a £12,000 target for his Silver Jubilee Fund. Donations from Members are still requested and there is to be a presentation at the Annual Dinner Dance on 23rd November 1974.

Club Finances are still quite low and any Member who wishes to organise any Fund Raising activities will receive encouragement and help from the Management Committee.

## CLIMBING - GENERAL PRINCIPLES

I was recently invited to look through some old climbing literature belonging to a near neighbour of mine who, surprisingly, has never set foot on a mountain. He often reads, and identifies himself with the many 'greats' of climbing whose adventures have given him much pleasure over the years. One favourite passage he often quotes was written by G. Winthrop-Young: "If we like mountains, our only principle need be that of pursuing the happiest kind of adventure which is consistent with the degree of our experience, with our sense of proportion, and with our respect for noble scenery and a royal sport. For our adventuring, we require only good courage, good-humour, and, if we wish it, good friends. For our joint achievement, we have to make ourselves safe climbers, of sound discretion, and unselfish colleagues upon a rope. To become good individual climbers, we have to train our limbs and discipline our nerves until movement is masterful, confident and easy. To become good mountaineers, we have to acquire judgement and experience without diminishing our original spirit of enterprise. The rules of collective climbing with others remain the social rules of all good comradeship expressed in terms of mountain action!
