NOVEMBER LETTER FROM DRIGG RECTORY

November Remembering

November is the time of year when we remember. As the nights draw in, and the weather gets a little cooler, it is the perfect time to pause, breath deep and take time to remember.

On November 11th we take time to stop to remember those men and women who have died in the line of duty. We do this as it is important to remember the sacrifice many people have made to fight for the freedoms that we enjoy.

In November, we may also take time to remember those in our families who have passed away recently or in years past. These memories can be painful as we grieve our loss and feel the space these people have left behind, but it is important that we do remember, it is important that we grieve and it is important that we find people that we can talk to - don't deal with it alone if you can help it.

Whilst our remembering in November can be a time of sadness, it can also be a time of joy as we take time to remember good times, and as we anticipate the celebration of Christmas just around the corner. Whether it is with great joy or great sadness, what is important is that we take the time...

to stop. hit Pause. breath deep.

The Bible contains a book called the Psalms. It has 150 chapters and contains many different songs and poems that capture how we often feel - from celebratory songs to psalms where the person writing has lost all hope in God and where they cry out, 'God where are you?' These books give us permission to ask these questions when we struggle with hard times. It's gritty and real. Life isn't all good times.

The 46th Psalm begins by saying that God is "our refuge and our strength". This is a strong statement about the way God wants to care for us and show love to each one of us. Then, in verse 10, the writer challenges us to "Be still and know that I am God". I have read that the phrase 'be still' can mean 'vacate', and in that sense the verse is encouraging us to let go and let God be God. This is a challenge for us all, as we wrestle with what it means to trust God, and to allow him to be our refuge and our strength.

As we look towards Christmas, we are reminded that Christ came to walk among us, to be with us to show us God's love in person. He still wants to do that today - to walk with us through pain... and to celebrate 'Joy' with us. We embrace both, letting go of the need to control our responses and allowing space for healing and hope and future joy. There is no time scale for this, but I do believe in a God that wants to be with us as we remember, a God that grieves with us as we work through dark times, and a God that joins in our celebrations and desires to bring new life. I pray that you can find the grace to walk through this season of remembrance and that a seed of hope can be planted in each one of us as we look towards the light of love that is revealed in Christ.

GOSFORTH PARISH CHURCH MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The October meeting was a regular meeting to consider matters re the maintenance and running of St Mary's, as always with our 5 marks of mission in mind. We looked at the accounts for July & August and the review of the budget, noting that we have not yet had to draw on reserves in 2022, and in 2023 we hope to slowly rebuild these reserves to the level we had before covid struck.

Regretfully for a number of reasons we have had to cancel the planned Christmas Fair. This will mean the need for several events to compensate for the loss of our main fund-raising event of the year. The Methodists at Seascale have generously offered us a table at their Christmas Fair and we have decided to accept.

Malcolm had been on a course and reported to us on Safeguarding and Health and Safety, which we discussed in relation to St Mary's. We also discussed issues relating to inconsiderate parking resulting in delivery vehicles being unable to reach the Gosforth Hall hotel.

We looked at services for the Christmas period and settled on a pattern very similar to last year, but these can't be confirmed until the availability of people to lead them is checked.

It was clarified that when the new burial ground management system is up and running (some considerable time ahead) we will be able to update it ourselves. We will get an estimate for a new bell rope system. We also discussed heating and lighting and decided that services in January and February would be in St Mary's Room to save money and keep warm. The next regular management meeting to monitor the situation will be on Tuesday 10th January and the report will be in the February magazine.

We noted that on the updated electoral roll there are now 123 on St Mary's Roll and 147 on the Parish Roll.



NEWS FROM GADS



The rehearsals for Cinderella began on 1 November so **Plays for Pleasure** is suspended until the end of January. Our **Youth Theatre Group** is already fully subscribed and that's now on a Wednesday evening so it will continue through most of the panto rehearsals.

In the last couple of months, we have been fortunate enough to receive a grant from the Mid Copeland GDF Community Partnership. Based on the success of "Oliver!" we applied for funds to buy our own (improved) sound equipment so that we don't have to hire it in next time. Not only that, but we have configured it so that most of it can be used by other Hall users. The Hall now has 4 powerful PA speakers, with inputs for sound recordings or music and 2 wireless microphones. The Pilates and Yoga groups have already made use, U3A, WI and other regular users are close behind and it should make a huge difference to the sound quality of the next Pantomime.

The Pantomime "Cinderella" is written by Alan Frayn, who has written several of our recent pantos. It is suitable for all ages and the performances will be at 7pm from Wed 18 to Fri 20 Jan and at 1pm and 6pm on Sat 21 Jan. Doors will open half an hour before each show. 
GOSFORTH WI

We have finally signed a new lease for the Car Park & Toilets from Copeland Council together with a grant of £5K for initial improvements to the Toilets.

A bid for a grant from the GDF towards a significant upgrade of the main Public Hall Building, is being prepared.

Parking in the Village is a continuing problem and discussions are being held with Sellafield and Gosforth School on possible ways of reducing the problems. One thing we are going to try, is to close the Playing Fields Car Park gate on some early mornings in an endeavour to ensure parking is available later in the day for playing field users.

A grant application for the Outdoor Gym on the Playing Fields has been submitted to the GDF.
