FROM GOSFORTH RECTORY

EXPRESSIONS

A while back, I was out walking with my family in the South Lakes. All of a sudden, our dog Wilmot barked, and bolted towards a line of mature Lawson Cypress trees that were planted along the edge of a piece of Forestry Commission woodland. He was in hot pursuit of a grey squirrel which skipped up the tree, and disappeared into the thicket of Lawson branches. When we caught up, we found the dog jumping up and down helplessly, barking up a tree with no squirrel in it....and as we watched, a light went on simultaneously in all of our heads.... 'so that is where the expression comes from!'

Expressions form a wonderfully rich part of our, equally wonderful, language don't they? When I worked as a wood cutter, we would occasionally find old saw pits in the woods, where my more elderly work mates would enjoy telling me stories about 'top-dogs' and 'under-dogs', and what a real day's work must have felt like in 'the good old days'.

There are so many expressions aren't there? My Dad used to enjoy using them to put me back in my place....he would say: 'Philip....it's one thing to be a cool as a cucumber....but quite another to be as green!'.....and, as I groaned, and muttered something teenage back, he would stomp off , usually saying something like: 'You're so sharp you'll cut yourself.'

For most of us, life can often seem like one long struggle to express ourselves and to be properly understood. The things we say are often misinterpreted, and when this happens — as we all know — we have to make a choice as to whether we are going to 'ride out the storm', or 'weigh anchor' and 'sail into the sunset'.....or indeed, whether we are going to 'take it on the chin' and 'eat some humble pie'. I used to work with a man who was habitually in trouble with his partner. Each day, he would mount his bike at four o'clock, and his parting shot would often be 'tongue pie and chicken's lips for tea then'.... as he made his way home to his loved ones.

By the time this copy of the magazine is out, we will be well on our way through Lent. And of course, Lent is all about facing ourselves, and admitting that sometimes we fail to understand each other; we say things



that are misconstrued, we don't forgive one another very easily....and perhaps worst of all...because of the frustration of all this....we often lash out at the failings of other people, as if we were perfect. It's not very nice really. But there is a way out for the brave...

In the story of the woman caught in adultery, a group of men turn on a woman who has been 'caught in the act'. They decide to put the woman to death by stoning her, and, famously, Jesus steps in to save her ...both from the men and from the destructive patterns of behaviour that have governed her life up until that point. He disarms her accusers by forcing them to face themselves, and answer the question: 'Is anyone perfect?' Then Jesus sets the woman free. He makes it clear to her, that, what she has done can never be right, and must be left completely behind, if she is to find 'release' and a new life. He then writes in the sand as he does all this.

I like to think that the expression 'to draw a line in the sand' comes from Jesus' act on that day. Why?...well, it helps me to remember that this is how God deals with my mistakes.....and heaven knows I make plenty....so many in fact, that I feel very confident, that I could repeat most of them almost without trying! For me, Lent is a good time to watch Jesus as he stoops down to draw lines in the sand for every single one of us. What a lovely thing. What a loving thing. What a relief!

GOSFORTH PARISH CHURCH MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Gosforth Parish Church Management Committee met on Tuesday 14th February. We were pleased to find that we had managed to transfer money back into the Reserve Fund so that it was now slightly above the amount recommended by the charity commission. We looked at likely expenditure in 2023 which included stonework over the porch, work on the roof, new gutters and some work in the churchyard. Repairs to the clock and the bells were authorised but, as these are village assets too, we will be trying for grants towards their cost. We noted that we had received a grant for the cost of the bulbs used to switch to LED lighting, which will reduce our electricity costs in the future. We also noted that the new grass cutting regime was already leading to a more diverse flora and fauna, but the saving on costs was not as high as hoped for because of the current economic situation. So that we can keep the digital records of the graves up to date, when our section of the new National Scheme becomes active, we authorised the payment of a small monthly access fee to enable this to happen. With all these in mind, we passed the Budget for 2023 and decided our offer towards the Parish Share for 2024 would remain the same as for this year. As last year, our fund raising for 2023 will be a number of smaller events rather than one big one, and will include a Coffee in the Garden event in June.

As a result of a visit by two of our wardens and the vicar to Hexham Abbey and two other historic churches, the plans for changes inside the church had altered and the application for faculties and grants, previously agreed, have been withheld until later. Discussions are ongoing and advice is being obtained from people with relevant experience. It was decided a working party in the churchyard was needed before the grass started to grow too rapidly.

We then prepared for the APCM on 18th April by looking at what was needed in the elections and the Draft Annual Report from this committee to the PCC.

The next scheduled management meeting is on Tuesday 9th May and the report will be in the June magazine. If you have anything you wish us to consider at that meeting, please phone 01946 725 300.



We have had a long and happy association with Traidcraft and their contribution to the fair trade movement goes back to its start. Seascale and Gosforth Methodist Churches began to sell their goods about forty years ago, running stalls at soup lunches, coffee mornings ans Tea and Chat meetings and putting on special events for FairTrade Fortnight almost every year.

The work with children from Gosforth School and magnificent exhibitions in Gosforth Chapel, were particularly effective in spreading the message behind the Trade Justice movement.

Where do we go from here? When the present stock is sold, there will be no more Traidcraft goods but there will still be fairly traded goods in the village shop, the Co-op and the supermarkets. Please continue to buy these where you can.

And don't forget, the Food Bank will continue to operate and the need for its help continues to increase. Lent is a good time to remember how blest we are here in Gosforth! What is our response?



WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY

This runs from 18 to 25 January each year, and ends on the day we remember the Conversion of St Paul (on the road to Damascus). The week is linked to this event because Paul had a lot to say about unity in his letters in the New Testament, not least in Galatians 3:28 where he says 'we are all one in Christ Jesus.'

Our local Churches Together group has not been able to hold its regular events during the Covid pandemic, and we decided to use this year's Unity Week to re-launch.



We are very grateful to Phoenix Praise, who allowed us to 'piggy back' on their regular service on Sunday 22 January which gave us a basis for the evening, and lovely opening worship, with over 30 people attending.

We then had an illustrated talk by Andrew and Ruth Murray, local people who spent 25 years as missionaries in Papua New Guinea. We heard how they and their sons lived with a tribe in the north of the country, very isolated, and whose language had never been written down. So the first task was to learn the language, and teach the people how to read the words of that language when written using our alphabet. (It was found that some consonants were not needed, but two extra vowels had to be devised.) This then opened the way to translating the books of the New Testament and teaching the tribal people about the Christian faith. A spin off, of course, is that this also opens the way for reading more generally, and for improved education, so these missions are approved and encouraged by the government of PNG. The talk ended with a short film showing the first consignment of printed New Testaments being delivered – first to a jungle air-strip, then carried across (very rough) country by hand, and then the excitement of the villagers as their scriptures were handed out.

The evening ended with refreshments and fellowship. It was good to feel that we are 'back in business'. Our next event will be our AGM, on the evening of 7 March. (7.30 pm in Seascale Methodist Church Hall – all welcome.)

supported Wasdale Mountain Rescue with a donation for an after show cast photo, we thank you all too. We raised a very welcome £208.20 for their rescue funds.



GOSFORTH PARISH COUNCIL

Sellafield are introducing a procedure designed to limit Sellafield staff and Contractors parking in local villages, effectively preventing residents and visitors from parking to use village facilities.

They are issuing labelled passes to Gosforth residents who work at Sellafield, and only permitting people with these passes use of the shuttle buses to site.

Whilst welcoming this, the council consider that, although this will give some mitigation to the problem, it will only be solved by the establishment of a dedicated adequate Park and Ride site south of Sellafield. Hence the PC will continue to press Sellafield Management for such a facility.

Readers will have noticed that the "Outdoor Gym" on the Playing Field is now complete. However, users should note that the gym is designed for use by adults and children of at least secondary school age, therefore younger children must only use the gym when closely supervised by a responsible adult.
