## From Rev Dave Pilkington – Drigg Rectory

#### Happy Easter!

After a long, cold and often wet winter, we are starting to emerge into the warmth of Spring. Whilst we have had some incredibly beautiful days, surrounded by snow capped mountains, the spring flowers and warmer air bring a sense of joy, a whisper of excitement as new life emerges around us in the form of flowers, trees, crops and lambs skipping through the fields.

It is this sense of joy and new life that we are reminded of at Easter in the Christian Faith. As we enter into Holy Week, we are reminded again and again of God's love for each one of us. We go on a journey through the week, of welcome on Palm Sunday, uncertainty on Maundy Thursday, loss on Friday and celebration on Easter Sunday. This can often mirror our own journey through life, as we are always somewhere on that cycle of life, death and resurrection.

The Gospel of John tells the story of Jesus washing the disciples' feet at the last supper. Peter, one of Jesus' disciples, did not like this - and when Jesus insists, Peter asks Jesus to wash his whole body. So Jesus explained to him that the disciples did not need their whole bodies washed, as in baptism, because they are clean and don't need a bath - but they do need to clean their feet, as this is the part of the body that gets exposed to dirt and needs to be regularly cleaned. This is the same as the invitation we have to receive Communion each Sunday. Jesus says "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." His invitation does not remove our imperfections. It is an opportunity to keep bringing to God those issues or habits in our hearts that hinder us from experiencing a deeper level of love and from allowing ourselves to be transformed by that love as we let go and surrender our lives to God on an ongoing basis.

Then, as we move to Good Friday, we see Jesus demonstrating this surrender as he goes to the cross. We are told in Philippians that Jesus emptied himself on the cross. God holds nothing back from us. He poured out his love for us on the cross. This isn't the act of an angry God punishing his son, but a demonstration of self giving, radically forgiving, co-suffering love.. as one of my favourite writers puts it. It is this act of love that Jesus demonstrates that creates that whisper of excitement and promise of new life, whilst recognising that sometimes we need to go through suffering to get this. Another favourite writer of mine, Father Richard Rohr says this: "We suffer to get well. We surrender to win. We die to live. We give it away to keep it." The message of Christ is counterintuitive. Jesus didn't fight for power. He didn't seek comfort or his own gain. We are told in the book of Corinthians that through his life, death, resurrection and ascension into heaven, God was reconciling the world to himself. He suffered to bring life and demonstrate his love for us.

Sometimes we wander away from the path of love. We pursue things that build walls around our lives, and that seek our own comfort rather than what's best. In doing so, we can hinder that flow of love between us and God, others and ourselves. The message of Easter is that God is love, and is always reconciling. He never turns his face away from us. On Easter Sunday we celebrate the resurrection. What was dead has been brought back to life. Death has been conquered, and in that moment we all have the offer of new life. So as we celebrate Easter this year, let's take time to pause and ask ourselves, where in our lives do we need reconciliation? What needs to die to bring forth new life? My encouragement is that God is for you and wants you to experience greater freedom and joy in this life.

# St Olafs, Wasdale Head Faith in the Fells

**HOLY WEEK, EASTER and all of April** – Do call into St Olaf's during April to view the dramatic **14 Stations of the Cross** painted by renowned artist Jenny Hawke. The exhibition under the title **One Friday** tells the story of Jesus' final day in stunning modern images, a free booklet of the exhibition is available.

#### APRIL SERVICES at St Olaf's:

**Easter Day Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> April** – 11am Festival Holy Communion, led by Philip. **Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> April (St George's Day)** – 11am Morning Praise, led by Carolyn. *There are services at Nether Wasdale Church at 9.30am on 2<sup>nd</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup> April.* 

**VISITORS** – during winter months December, January, February we welcomed 3575 visitors to St Olaf's, an average of 40 each day. This compares with the daily average over the last year of 78, indicating there is no longer a truly low season at Wasdale Head. Visitor numbers are currently increasing by 17% p.a.

**RESTORATION FUNDRAISING** – a team of four volunteers under guidance from professional funding consultants, Gifted Philanthropy Ltd, are handling the appeal to cover the cost of St Olaf's restoration, which is being launched during April. It will be a national appeal to philanthropic sources – trusts, charities, institutional and commercial donors known to support projects of this type. There will also be an in-church appeal to our many visitors. All costs to date have been covered by St Olaf's own resources and our target is to have the funds in place by the year end so that work can commence in Spring 2024.

**THE FRCC WAR MEMORIAL** in St Olaf's churchyard attracts many visitors, and deservedly so since it was in the memory of their fallen comrades that the Fell & Rock Climbing Club purchased 3000 acres of high fells and gifted the land to the nation as 'an eternal monument among the everlasting hills'. Today, several walks, hikes and fell runs are based on this gift and by tradition start and end at St Olaf's. The 12 peaks included in the gift are Lingmell, Broad Crag, Great End, Seathwaite Fell, Allen Crags, Glaramara, Grey Knotts, Brandreth, Base Brown, Green Gable, Great Gable and Kirk Fell. To these, other donors added Scafell Pike, Esk Hause, and Castle Crag in Borrowdale.

LETS TALK ABOUT KNOTWEED:

It has been noticed that Knotweed has been seen growing along beck banks in the village and has been reported to the Parish Council. There is a lot of information about this on the computer -

1. It is fast growing - up to 10 cm a day - and resprouts quickly unless totally eradicated.

2. It can only be disposed of at Licensed land fill sites.

3. It can cause structural damage.

4. It is not illegal to let it grow on your land BUT it is ILLEGAL to let it spread to neighbouring properties!


5. It is not illegal to be growing on your land BUT it is ILLEGAL not to report it when selling a house.





**Notes from the artist:** The bleakness of the situation is illustrated by the rather muted colours. There is an inevitability about the two heartbroken figures that are directed to each other by Jesus. They stand alone, with a distant doorway behind them since their lives will continue once they leave this terrible cross. They are now family. As we all are.
