FROM GOSFORTH RECTORY

SEEDS

Every year there are three weeks of bluebells. They rise and bloom and die. And as they do so every year, I find myself in a panic. I want to 'be there' at the ultimate moment. I want to consume...to swim in...to paint... or even somehow to eat the blueness and the smell.... and to drink the growing greenness of it all. But, whatever I do in those three weeks, I find I cannot 'have', or 'hold back'...I cannot 'consume'... or even 'fix' any ownership over this time.

When I worked as a forester, I used to manage one block of woodland that was around 200 hectares in extent. One spring day, I worked out that around one third of the woodland was covered each spring with bluebells....about 66 football pitches...or 660000 square meters. On each square meter of bluebell woodland around 400 stems would spring up, giving a total of 264000000 stems...each year. On each stem there were 6 or 7 flowers each year...giving 1848000000 flowers each year. And then, after a couple of weeks the scene would pass away. The 'violet blue sea' would change into 'heavy green shade'. The bluebell plants would turn to straw yellow...and everywhere seed pods would form.

As I write in mid May, none of this has happened yet. But I have a faith that knows it will. I also know that when they are ready, the pods will 'POP' if you push your boots through the drying stalks. Then there will be the sound of tiny 'rains' and 'rolls' as each seed runs down the foliage and hits the soil... to be 'let in'... or not. In that 200 hectares of woodland there will be 1848000000 flowers...giving rise to 1848000000 seed pods - with 12 seeds in each. This year in June about 22176000000 seeds will hit the soil.

Why do we LOVE all this? We don't need it to survive. It certainly does not need anything from us.

A monk who worked outside with his hands once wrote: 'For it is God's love that warms me in the sun... and God's love that sends the cold rain. It is God's love that feeds me in the bread I eat, and God that feeds me also by hunger and fasting. It is the love of God that sends the winter days when I am cold and sick, and the hot summer when I labour and my clothes are full of sweat...but it is God who breathes on me with light winds off the river and in the breezes out of the wood. His love spreads the shade of the Sycamore over my head, and sends the water boy along the edge of the wheat field with a bucket from the spring, while the labourers are resting and the mules stand under the tree. It is God's love that speaks to me in the birds and the streams; but also behind the

clamour of the city God speaks to me in his judgements...and all these things are seeds sent to me from his will. If these seeds would take root in my liberty, and if his will would grow from my freedom, I would become the love that he is...and my harvest would be his glory and my own joy.' (Thomas Merton. New Seeds of Contemplation)

All this is in God's super-abundant reign. If we love it at all, it is because he first loved us. Whatever you do, do take a moment to enjoy it all. Every Blessing ...


It started off as the magazine for Gosforth and Wasdale, then Beckermet and Calderbridge joined us in 2021, so now we welcome Seascale too!

GOSFORTH PARISH CHURCH MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

At the May meeting we looked at our financial position. There had been a small deficit in April but our reserves are still above the level recommended by the charity commission.

It was agreed to get additional strip lighting for St Mary's Room and to start a 2-year contract in October with the C of E bulk buying company for electricity, which is produced in an eco-friendly way and is less expensive than the quote from our current provider.

We decided to celebrate the ordination of Emily Howarth (Ann Longworth's daughter), who was a member of St Mary's congregation during her formative years, by sending her a gift from St Mary's.

We noted the fund-raising event on Saturday morning 24th June at Ann McKenzie's home when there will be an open garden, coffee/tea and cakes, and a raffle.

We noted that Michael Darwell, Architect, is to do the quinquennial inspection for all 3 churches in the parish in the next few months.

There was then considerable discussion on the problems we have over flooding in the far North East corner of the churchyard, the broken gutters, the repairs to stonework near the main door and the repair to the bells, which will require scaffolding and is inter-linked with the chime on the clock. Some of this work is essential and will have to be done soon, but we decided only to do none essential work if we can get a grant.

The next meeting is on Tuesday 25th July and the report hopefully will be in the September magazine. If you have anything you wish us to consider please phone 01946 725 300.



St Olafs, Wasdale Head Faith in the Fells

JUNE SERVICES at St Olaf's:

Sunday 11th June 11am **Celtic Praise**Sunday 25th June 11am **Morning Praise**There are services at Nether Wasdale Church at 9.30am on 4th & 18th June.

THE GOOD SHEPHERD panel display in St Olaf's continues until the evening of Sunday 11th June. The illustrated panels feature this year's lambing season, and life among the farms, fields, and fells of Wasdale Head, all linked with biblical shepherd texts, to chime with the Thanksgiving for the Lambs service held at St Olaf's on Sunday 28th May. With the door open, the sheep and their lambs provided the perfect backdrop of sound for the service.

THE EARLIEST PHOTO OF ST OLAF'S? This photo was kindly donated by Brian Thomas from Birmingham. It was taken by Alfred Pettitt who owned a fine art gallery in Keswick. He was active as a photographer from 1855 until his death



in 1880. Prior to this kind donation, the oldest photo we had was taken in 1891 just prior to the start of the last major restoration of the church, see

below.



The yews in the Pettitt photo are estimated to be around 20 years old but have perhaps another ten years of growth on them in the 1891 photo above. If this yew assessment is roughly right, then the Pettitt photo was probably taken not much later than 1855. If anyone has an earlier one, we'd love a copy!

The bellcote in the Pettitt photo had been replaced by a taller one by 1891, and the latter was replaced in 1936 by the current bellcote. The photo above shows that the church bell was rung from the outside at that time.

Both photos show the poor state of the roof, which needed major repairs in the 1892 restoration, when the larch rafters and purlins were replaced with the Wasdale oak ones you see today, riding on the four original oak trusses. The wavy surface of the slates on the roof shows how the larch roof structure was struggling with the weight of the sturdy slates. The door shown on the earlier photograph is studded and opens the opposite way to the present one. The east wall and gate posts appear the same as today.

We are grateful to Russell Ould of Bluebell Office Services for his expert help in cleaning and restoring the original sepia photograph, now in our archives.







SAINT FOR JUNE - St Columba

On the 9th June we remember Columba, described in Common Worship as 'Abbot of Iona, Missionary'. He died in 597. Columba was born and brought up in Ireland where, after he had been ordained, he founded monasteries.

In 563 he arrived on Iona (Holy Island) with twelve companions to found his most famous monastery. Columba then went on to become a significant factor



in the conversion of the Picts, the Scots, and the Northern English. He was described as having the 'face of an Angel, polished in speech and holy in deed'.
