FROM GOSFORTH RECTORY

What does it all mean to you?

These days, it is easier to live in a privatised bubble than it is to fully open our eyes and ears to all the problems that beset us in modern Europe. Mass movements of desperate, displaced people, the slow death of democracy, the emergence of an ultra rich elite, and the aftermath of Covid 19 – all these phenomena confuse us. They make us worry about our 'rights'. Where do we stand? Amidst all of this, there has also been more to disturb us...we cannot fail to be mindful of the war that carries on in the Ukraine even now... as we enjoy the Spring weather. I don't know about you, but all this repeatedly leaves me wondering how much I have simply taken for granted, over the last 50 years, since people like me were born.

Back in the 1930's, there was a man called John Griffin, who controlled an enormous railway bridge over the Mississippi River. John took his young son along to work with him one day. After putting the massive drawbridge up, he was eating his lunch when, suddenly, he heard the whistle of the Memphis Express, roaring towards the river crossing. Leaping from the observation deck, Griffin ran to lower the bridge so that the train could safely cross the mighty river to the other side. But, as he ran, he glanced down, and felt his heart stop. John's son had fallen into the gearbox of the bridge, and was trapped. Desperately, he tried to devise a rescue plan, but there was no time - his son was down there and there were more than 400 passengers on the train, heading for certain disaster. Griffin knew what he had to do. He buried his face in his arm, and pushed the master switch. The bridge lowered, and the train thundered safely across to the other side. As the train passed by John Griffin found himself looking into the carriages, at businessmen reading newspapers, ladies sipping coffee, and children eating ice cream - all oblivious to the sacrifice that had given them a future. In agony he cried out, 'I sacrificed my son for you people. Don't you care?' But the train rolled on

At this uncertain point in our shared history, we must not forget those who are working sacrificially, in order to uphold what we see as our human rights and the democracies of the Western World. It is not an easy time to be in government! Having said that, it is also worth looking once more at the 'bigger picture'. It puts our troubles in context. In this world full of wrongdoing, injustice and death – full of sin - the Christian Faith points to a Father God, who, out of love for the world that he made, gave us his Son, to show us how to overcome our selfishness. Of course, instead of following his example, Jesus fell foul of the people he came to

save. He got caught 'in the cogs of the machine' and was killed on the cross by people just like me. But in the cross, we find a bridge to eternal life. Sin and death were defeated there. Faith in Christ, his sacrifice, his death and his resurrection, gives the hope of eternal life, no matter how difficult things get. Enjoy May, whatever it brings, and may the peace that comes from trusting in Christ reign in your hearts and minds, now and forever more! Amen.

St Olafs, Wasdale Head Faith in the Fells

MAY SERVICES at St Olaf's:

Sunday 14th May 11am **Morning Praise** Sunday 28th May 11am **Thanksgiving for the Lambs** There are services at Nether Wasdale Church at 9.30am on 7th & 21st May.

THE GOOD SHEPHERD is the title of a panel display that will run from Saturday 20th May through till Sunday 11th June to complement the **Thanksgiving for the Harvest of the Lambs**, see above. The Bible has many shepherd texts and Wasdale's fields are full of lambs – there's no lack of inspiration for this display!

VISITORS are also a 'harvest' to be thankful for, and they are the lifeblood of the valley and its many hospitality venues, and the church too. Numbers are increasing each year, in tune with the growing popularity of the western Lakes.

RESTORATION FUNDRAISING - the in-church appeal to our many visitors was launched just before Easter. A lengthy application process to reach national and regional philanthropic sources, institutional and commercial donors, charities, and trusts, known to support projects of this sort, is now underway and will occupy much of the spring and summer, and perhaps beyond!

ST OLAF'S PCMC meets twice annually at the Wasdale Head Inn. At the spring meeting we reviewed the 2022 accounts, these showed a healthy increase in receipts and a slight reduction in church running costs, which has enabled us to cover the cost of the restoration's preliminary surveys, environmental research, and the design and planning stages of the architect's brief without withdrawing reserves. As a registered charity, our accounts are published and can be inspected on the Charity Commission website. We also reviewed restoration plans, mission and worship and visitor numbers etc.

The PCMC also took the decision to re-occupy the Old School from the end of March 2024 as it is needed to store the church furniture while the restoration of St Olaf's is underway. The organ is the only exception, it is going to Durham to be refurbished. Thereafter, the Old School needs substantial refurbishment and the PCMC will be considering its future carefully over the next 18 months. Meanwhile the restoration of St Olaf's is the focus of attention.






Recent regular meetings have included -

SAINT FOR MAY - BEDE

On the 25th of May we remember the Venerable Bede, described in Common Worship as 'Monk of Jarrow (in Northumberland) Scholar and Historian'. He lived from childhood to his death in the double monastery (with monks and nuns living separately) of Wearmouth/Jarrow.

Bede wrote many books, the best-known being 'The Ecclesiastical History of the English People'. He

was a Benedictine monk, and he is usually shown wearing a habit and carrying a book, possibly the one that made him so famous that he is often described as 'The Father of English History'.

EVENING SERVICES IN GOSFORTH



Many readers of this magazine will know that the Gosforth Methodist Congregation now meets in St Mary's Room on the first and third Sundays of most months, at 6.30pm. But fewer folk may be aware that, although these services are Methodist-led, anyone and

everyone is warmly welcome to attend, from members of St Mary's or other local churches, to folk with no church allegiance or no faith at all.

Our services are always friendly and informal, and we encourage as much interaction as possible, whilst recognising that some folk are much happier to sit quietly and let others do the talking. Everyone is free to sing with gusto or just to sit back and listen during the hymns and songs, to ask questions or make comments on the readings and sermon, and to pray out loud during prayer times or just sit and pray or think in silence.

'Third Sundays' are particularly family-friendly; children and young people often take a leading role in these services, and there are usually sketches, games or other activities to join in with or just to watch and enjoy. 'First Sundays' are more geared towards the grown-ups, and are particularly appreciated by those folk who may find themselves doing lots of 'giving' on a Sunday morning in other churches. On a Sunday evening it can be very therapeutic for those with stewarding, preaching or worship-leading commitments in the morning to be able to relax, unwind and receive some spiritual refreshment themselves. Sometimes our 'first Sundays' include Holy Communion, but the service still feels very informal, with no set liturgy. Our intention is to provide a contrast to the more structured and/or liturgical format of many morning services, and although we follow the main pattern of the Church's year, we often depart from standard lectionary readings.

Our music is usually a mix of traditional hymns and more contemporary worship songs and choruses. We happily use material from any period and in any style so long as it communicates the message we want to put across: that there is a God who loves each one of us, and who wants to communicate with us all, both individually and when we meet for worship and fellowship together.
