## Decisions

Decisions, decisions! For the last two weeks, I have been trying to decide when I should sit down and write the letter for the Parish Magazine. I admit, I am one of the world's worst offenders, when it comes to finding 'other things to do' as a deadline approaches. This time it has been no different. I am not sure... but I think it is the amount of change that is happening everywhere all the time that has made me distracted. To be honest, my attention is split all over the place.
What am I to do?
At this time of year, things are changing for people all over the place. People are finishing their 'Gap year', or going back to school to start on an 'exam year'. Some people are coming to the end of a long summer break and suddenly realising that they have to head off to university. Others are trying to settle into new schools which one young person described to me as being a bit more 'shovey and sweary' than they had expected! Some people are 'moving in' to take on new jobs. Some people are trying to move out and retire, but finding that their plans have had to change at the last minute. Some people are getting used to unexpected news. Nationally - and in the Church of England - the politics is on the move again, which just makes me want to know how they manage to stop it all in the first place if it is so important. I often wonder why we don't just call this time of year, 'New Year' and have a fire work display hang on a minute... maybe we do have those again soon! ...

Change is confusing. Change is uncomfortable. Change can be inspiring. Change is often sad. Change can make people feel powerless. Change can be ignored for a while, and of course, change can be an opportunity to be embraced. All these statements can be true, but for change to be managed, people must be ready, both in their hearts and their minds. Being 'ready' means energetically thinking things through...and, dare I suggest it in this secular age, even opening them up to God in prayer? 'Here he goes!' I hear you mumble....

Jesus lived in a time of complete upheaval. He walked a dangerous line between the 'powers' of his age; he walked with courage, by prayer, and with normal people on his heart. If Jesus had lived in the UK today, I don't think he would have been distracted. I think he would have been talking to his neighbours. That's what he did back then in a time of massive change - and that is what I think he would be doing today. He'd be thinking about the future, and how people would get on with each other, as the world changed around them. He would be talking about The Kingdom. How can I say this with confidence? Because he is on record as saying 'Love your neighbour as you love yourself'....

None of us knows what being a neighbour will mean in the coming year, but whatever the future may bring, we must be determined to support and love the people who live next door to us without reservation. After all - in the midst of all this change... what would we do without them?!

## HARVEST FESTIVALS IN THE BENEFICE

Most of our churches this year would prefer, if possible, harvest donations of food that would be suitable to pass on to the Foodbank all must be non-perishable. Below is a list of suitable items:

Fruit juice - UHT, milk UHT (full fat or semi skimmed) in cartons, cereals
Tinned: soups, beans, carrots, peas, sweetcorn, tomatoes, spaghetti, ravioli, macaroni cheese, hot dogs, chicken, meat balls, chicken, tuna, rice, custard, fruit, sponge puddings.
Dried rice and pasta, pasta sauces, instant mashed potato. Tea, coffee, jam, biscuits.

Gosforth will be decorating their church on Thursday morning $28^{\text {th }}$ Sept. for the Gosforth School Harvest on the Friday morning. Do come and help if you can - everyone welcome! There will be refreshments for helpers as usual. Any donations of flowers or greenery would be gratefully received and can be left at the back of church beforehand or dropped off on the morning.

The Benefice Harvest Supper will be held in Calderbridge Village Hall at 7.00 pm on Thursday 28 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ September. It will be a Bring \& Share Supper, so please bring along either a savoury dish or a dessert/cake to share with everyone else, something to drink and an item of food for the local Foodbank. After supper there will be an easy quiz.

Admission is free but donations and the proceeds from a Raffle will go towards the Bishop's Harvest Appeal.

# Christ, Christians and the Church Six Studies in Ephesians 

Gosforth Methodist Congregation in conjunction with Phoenix Praise and the South Calder Mission Community are organising/hosting a series of studies in Ephesians for the autumn study season.

These will take place fortnightly on Thursdays in autumn, commencing on Thursday September 21 ${ }^{\text {st }}$, in St Mary's Room, Gosforth, at 20:00 and over Zoom. It is hoped that some 'face to face' Zoom venues will be set up in the north of the Methodist Circuit. Refreshments will be available in Gosforth, from 19:30. Each session will last an hour with informal chat before and after.

There will be six studies which will be based, roughly, on the six chapters of Ephesians.

The aim is to address basic and practical issues concerning what it means to be a Christian, what the Christian life consists of and to explore what Church life should be like in the modern world. These studies are intended to be fun, uplifting and, above all, practical. They will involve short presentations, small group discussions and question and answer sessions.
