FROM OUR CURATE RACHEL

Every year, I wonder at just how dark it seems in the evenings when the clocks change. It doesn't seem that long ago that it was light when I was going to bed, yet now I'm not even home from my daytime activities before it goes dark! As the days shorten into the winter months, it seems we have little daylight at all.

As a child I was scared of the dark, I didn't like not being able to see what was around me. I had a wild imagination, thinking something or someone might be lurking in the shadows waiting to jump out at me! I am still not completely at ease in the dark.

Physical darkness brings to mind the realities of the powers of darkness and spiritual forces of evil at work in the world. In the winter months when it is dark outside, I like to see the warm glow of light coming from people's homes as one passes by, the cosiness of a fire lit in the living room, the flicking of candlelight in a dark home, the twinkling of stars in the night sky. These lights bring me comfort, give me hope and fill me with joy.

Next month it will be Advent and so our minds are turning towards Christmas and the coming of Jesus Christ, who is the Light of the World. Light which shines in the darkness and is not overcome by it. He is the light which brings real comfort, hope, and joy into our lives.

Jesus tells his followers that we are to be the light of the world. By living in Christ, being bearers of His God-image in the world, we reflect His light and are to live as children of light, shining His light into the darkness of this world. How might we do this?

Paul the apostle tells us that the fruit of the light is found in all that is good, right, and true. It is not always easy to see and to know what is good, right, and true in our world today, we need the Holy Spirit to guide us. But it is in the darkness that light shines brightest of all, so in these dark days of winter, let's shine the light of Jesus Christ.

As a member of the Methodist Church I am called to:


- worship within the local church, including regular sharing in Holy Communion, and through personal prayer

Christ, Christians and the Church Six Studies in Ephesians

Gosforth Methodist Congregation in conjunction with Phoenix Praise and the South Calder Mission Community are organising/hosting a series of studies in Ephesians for the autumn study season.

These will take place fortnightly on Thursdays in autumn, commencing on Thursday September 21st, in St Mary's Room, Gosforth, at 20:00 and over Zoom. It is hoped that some 'face to face' Zoom venues will be set up in the north of the Methodist Circuit. Refreshments will be available in Gosforth, from 19:30. Each session will last an hour with informal chat before and after.

There will be six studies which will be based, roughly, on the six chapters of Ephesians.

The aim is to address basic and practical issues concerning what it means to be a Christian, what the Christian life consists of and to explore what Church life should be like in the modern world. These studies are intended to be fun, uplifting and, above all, practical. They will involve short presentations, small group discussions and question and answer sessions.

Complex theological issues will be avoided but a reading list will be made available for trouble makers or those who would like to explore more deeply! There won't be an exam. (Well not in this life at least...)

## St Olafs, Wasdale Head faith in the fells

**VIP VISIT** – it was good to welcome Cumbria's Lord Lieutenant and High Sheriff, Alex and Samantha Scott, on 22<sup>nd</sup> September. It was their request to come to see the church and its restoration plans. As The King's representatives in Cumbria, their duties include supporting the voluntary sector and community projects like this. They enjoyed their



visit, despite some genuine Wasdale weather! The visit started with lunch at the Sawmill and concluded at the Old School on the Green, which the PCMC will be managing from April onwards.

**ST OLAF's PCMC** trustees held their bi-annual meeting at the Inn on 11<sup>th</sup> October at 5.30pm, followed by supper. As usual, all 9 trustees were present. The main business was to approve and sign off the architect's restoration plans, so that the faculty and planning applications can be prepared. These were passed unanimously. The treasurer, Carolyn, was able to report the healthy state of St Olaf's finances. Restoration fundraising now totals £77,500, with a further £17,500 promised/ expected from local and in-church donations. The current forecast for the cost of the restoration is £165,000. On that basis we have another £70,000 to raise before April 2024. Donations can be made via our website, or on www.justgiving.com/campaign/wasdaleheadchurch or by card or cash in St Olaf's. We are very grateful for so much local support.

**HARVEST** – our Harvest Thanksgiving and in-church donations from visitors during Harvest Week enabled St Olaf's to send £75 worth of food (all from the Foodbank's list), and a donation of £275 to the North Lakes Foodbank.

**MORE HELP** – we need to enlarge the current small team of three who undertake all the daily tasks demanded by our busy church, a workload exacerbated temporarily by the restoration project and fundraising. We need a second warden, a younger one, to share the load and assist with the care of the church and churchyard, help with the marketing and promotion of the church, its digital development, and visitor care. Philip is fully supportive of the need for more help, and the aim is to have at least one new warden ready to join us by the APCM in March/April. Please pray for this. We also need more help with the spiritual development of the church, to improve and extend its ministry to visitors/pilgrims, and its ecumenical role, and to help with leading services. This search is already underway. St Olaf's is growing in all but size. The need is to be laying sound foundations for its future growth and mission, so the church is ready for its new life after the restoration.

**REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY – 12<sup>th</sup> November** this year – is always a big event at Wasdale Head with a huge gathering at the replica Fell & Rock Climbing Club Memorial on Great Gable's summit, and a usually well attended Act of Remembrance that starts beside the FRCC Memorial in St Olaf's churchyard and concludes in church. Please be at either location by around 10.50 so the ceremonies and 2-minutes silence can start at 11 o'clock.

This is the centenary of the FRCC Memorial, and around it we remember the 6 young men from Wasdale and 21 FRCC members who were killed in WWI, and the 12 FRCC members and the 8 airmen who died in the four aircraft that crashed into the fells that surround Wasdale Head during WWII.

The service at St Olaf's on Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> November at 11am is Morning Worship.

#### **BECKERMET NEWS**

What a transformation there has been in our small village since those long lock down days of Covid19, hopefully never to be repeated, with the reopening of the Reading Rooms and the vast improvement of the village play area. This transformation has been due to two major factors. The first being the dedicated work of small bands of volunteers who have rolled their sleeves up and put in the time and effort into improving the life of the village. Secondly even with their hard work and determination neither of these would have been possible without the financial support of the GDF which has funded both the refurbishment of the Reading Rooms and the upgrading of the play area facilities. Beckermet has, along with other local communities, been fortunate to be able to tap into this much needed source of funding.

The Reading Rooms once barely utilised have now become the heart of the activities that have encouraged residents to come out and participate in a wide range of activities for all ages within our community. There is rarely a day when there isn't some activity going on in this building with some days two or three taking place. The refurbishment has greatly improved the facilities and it is now a pleasure to be in the building. The activities on offer for anyone to attend have included, art class, decorating stones, card making, wet felting, pen & water colours, exploring acrylic paint with others planned for wax melt workshop, macrame decorations and wreath making for Christmas. For the more energetic there are a variety of more physical activities such as yoga, village choir, pound workout, couch to 5K for beginners, Pilates and most recently the introduction of Bollywood Dancing. If you are interested in finding out what is available and when then visit the Reading Rooms or Beckermet Village Facebook pages.

If taking part in activities/workshops is not for you then there are other opportunities for you to get away from the same old four walls and meet other like-minded people by coming along and spending an enjoyable time with friends at either of the Coffee Cake & Chat sessions that take place each week on a Tuesday from 9.30-11.30am or on a Thursday from 1.30-3.30pm. Tea, Coffee biscuits together with a variety of cakes are all available. There is no charge for tea/coffee and cakes just a donation would be welcome but not compulsory. You do not need to live within Beckermet to be able to attend these sessions so it would be lovely to see new faces coming along to join in with our regular members.

In addition to our regular Coffee Cake & Chat sessions our Quiz Nights & Bingo Evenings continue to be enjoyed by our regulars with new comers always welcome to join in. We always try and make both these entertaining with lots of fun and laughter. If you are interested then please note the following dates for your diary- Quiz Nights Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> November & Friday 1<sup>st</sup> December with Bingo on Friday 20<sup>th</sup> October, Friday 17<sup>th</sup> November & Friday 15<sup>th</sup> December. Each event starts at 6.30pm in the Reading Rooms and lasts for approximately two hours. It would be lovely to see you attend these evenings regardless of where you live as it is always lovely to see new people coming along and having

an enjoyable evening. Keep as eye on both the Reading Room and Beckermet Village Facebook pages for adverts for these activities together with new dates coming on line throughout 2024.

Over the weekend of the 22<sup>nd</sup> & 23<sup>rd</sup> of September the Reading Rooms celebrated it's100th Birthday following its opening back September in 1923. On the Friday evening there was a music night to begin the celebrations followed be a Special Free Event on the Saturday with the official reopening taking place at 3pm. During the afternoon there were two displays, one about the history of the Reading Rooms & village with the second covering what we can look forward to in the future. This activity was well attended with tea cakes and refreshments provided. The refurbishment of the Reading Rooms has included a small bar which will be able to provide refreshments at all events especially on band nights and fundraising activities. As a feature and a fundraising activity, they have sold wooden plaques to members of the community who have had messages professionally inscribed on them. These have been placed on the Bar of Legends providing an interesting feature in the room.

A new event taking place this year was the Beckermet Village Scarecrow Festival which took place in early September culminating in the competition being judged by the head of the local village school on Sunday 8th September during afternoon teas in the Reading Rooms. There were some nine entries which was good for the first festival. They certainly brought colour and some laughter and joy to the village. Well done to all who took the time and effort to participate in this first scarecrow festival that will be repeated next year and hopefully become a regular feature of village activities as has been common in other communities. St John's Church continues to hold two services per month on the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Sundays with the Rev. Philip Dorling taking one service and the recently appointed Rev. Rachel Cunliffe taking the second. The Harvest Festival service took place on Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> October with a good attendance from the village. A good quantity of tinned and packet food items were brought along by the congregation for distribution to the local food bank after the service. Many thanks to all who contributed to this worthy cause. The regular collection of food items continues to be collected and these can be left in the box at the front entrance to the Reading Rooms. Another activity organised for the benefit of St John's Church is the monthly soup lunches that are being held in the Reading Rooms. While the Reading Rooms were closed for refurbishment it was not possible to continue to provide them. These soup lunches recommenced in September and always take place on the third Wednesday of the month. The next two will take place on 18<sup>th</sup> October & 16<sup>th</sup> November. Please come along and enjoy the opportunity to have a bowl or even two of soup plus cake for  $\pm 6$ and take part in the raffle with all profits going to the church.

Like in many towns and villages all around the country a Special Coffee Morning event for Macmillan took place on Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> October from 10am-12noon in the Reading Rooms to raise funds to help them continue with their magnificent work. As well as the refreshments there was also some fundraising activities including a raffle & tombola to help raise even more funds for their cause. I am

A big thank you to all who supported this activity with either baking, volunteering on the day or attending to help raise such a wonderful total. Next year we will try even harder as we would like to raise even more funds for this wonderful organisation.

Within the Reading Rooms we continue to have quite a large selection of books in our lending library which you are more than welcome to take away and read at no cost. If on the other hand you would like to take away the book for keeps then a small donation would be welcome. Food donations continue to be collected for those who continue to struggle during these difficult financial times. If you feel able to donate something then the box for donating food can be found in the front porch of the Reading Rooms. Any donation however small will be greatly appreciated. (tinned/packet etc not fresh)

The new village fundraising lottery had its first draw on the Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> September with the three lucky winners receiving £50, £30 & £20 respectively. This new fundraising activity is being run by the Beckermet Village Association on a 50/50 basis. Since we launched the idea of a village lottery the numbers participating have gradually increased and we now have nearly 150 members. This means that over the year we will be handing out at least £1,700 in prizes with a further similar amount available to help good causes within our community. The monthly draw takes place in the Reading Rooms during Coffee Cake & Chat sessions on the first Tuesday of every month with the next two being on 7<sup>th</sup> November and 5th December. Several dates for your diary- In the Reading Rooms on Fri 3<sup>rd</sup> November the Mustangs are playing while on the 3<sup>rd</sup> December from 2-4pm there is a Christmas Market also in the Reading Rooms. On Friday 1<sup>st</sup> December there will be a service in church followed by the switch on of the village lights in the grounds.

The Reading Rooms are a valuable asset for the community of Beckermet and it is wonderful to see them being so well used after the refurbishment and this must please those hard-working volunteers and directors who have made this possible. This asset is for all to use and it is vital that we all support as far as possible the different activities that are being made available at present and over the months ahead.


held our Harvest Festival in the church which was very well attended by parents and wider family. Each class performed a Harvest themed song and we had a blessing from Philip.


#### **GOSFORTH PARISH COUNCIL**

It was reported that some car sharing by school staff was now taking place, but this doesn't seem to be significantly helping the parking problem at the entrance to Denton Park.


