LITTLE BLACK BAGS

Easter has come and gone and, like most clergy families, we do what we can to get a bit of rest after the 'big day'. Normally, that involves walking. One of our favourite places to walk is Gummer's Howe in the South Lakes - there's plenty of parking, a well marked track, lots of friendly people in holiday mood, and 'knock-out' views over Windermere and across to the Old Man of Coniston. It is always wonderful. This Easter, there was also something else that I am afraid has become a feature of our rural life for the last ten or so years...little black bags all over the place. Mostly, they were neatly tied up at the top. Some were thoughtfully tucked away in-between tree roots and cracks in the dry-stone walls. Others were hanging in the bushes. The most blatant were just by the stile - to be 'picked up' when the dog owner returned... maybe...never! Once you start to notice something, you see it everywhere don't you? Even closer to home!

Some time ago I went on another walk. It took us along a river bank in the Spring sunshine. On that occasion, I went with a big black plastic bag in my pocket. Before long, I had found a 'black bag' full of little black bags... as well as an assortment of other old bottles and tins. I took them to the bin by the footpath gate at the start of the walk. I confess the exercise made me feel a bit smug. After fifteen years of working outside in the woods, I am not a fan of the contents of 'the little black bag', or of any kind of litter for that matter! In fact, the truth is that I think that it is excellent that it has become socially unacceptable in this country to let our four-footed friends 'foul' public footpaths and playgrounds... but isn't there something a bit strange about going to the trouble of bagging up the problem, and then leaving it somewhere, in full view, where it will then take years to disappear from our beautiful countryside? Apparently, some of the little black bags are biodegradable. That may be the case... but so are the contents... unless you wrap them in a bag!

In the modern phenomenon of the 'little black bag' by the path, I think it could be that there is something interesting for us to think about as we travel on from Easter towards the Ascension and Pentecost...and the rest of the year. It is a spiritual lesson. We are all on a journey. It is a path through life. Occasionally things happen that leave a mess – something that doesn't smell too good – and gets nasty if people step in it. Very often, it is extremely tempting to 'bag up' these messy times...put a knot in them...and then hide them somewhere where we hope they will be forgotten. But of course they never are. They don't go away that easily, and inside the bag the problem remains!

The gospels show us a God who wants to wash our problems down, and,

in the process, deal with them once and for all, so that instead of hanging around, they can become useful experiences, and fertile places where new things can grow – after all, in time the messiest of experiences become the manure in which new things do grow. In time, the rain that turns our trials into triumphs is called 'God's grace'. The 'rain of grace' only starts to fall when we are open and honest... and when forgiveness is in the air.

Looking back, I can easily see plenty of things I have 'bagged up' and tried to hide in the bushes - often with a double knot on top! I still do it. But the truth is, it is much better to deal with things as they happen, rather than pretending that they do not matter. It is much better to find a proper home, where you can unpack your problems and let the rain of grace and a good dose of fresh air do its work. When things are working properly that is the role of the church and the body of Christ in our lives. It is an atmosphere which should be safe. When it is, things begin to blossom. There are some signs of that blossoming amongst us at the moment... so 'Praise God'... He is so good.

THE OLD SCHOOL – on the Green, has returned to the care of St Olaf's after a 60 year tenancy, and the Trustees meet shortly to decide on its future - this will be reported in this magazine's June issue.

GREAT GIFT PEAKS ROUND – this epic endurance feat starts and ends at the FRCC Memorial in St Olaf's churchyard. It is 39.2km in length, has an elevation gain of 3112 metres and a target completion time of 11hrs! The round takes in the summits of fourteen peaks: Grey Knotts, Base Brown, Great Gable, Green Gable, Kirk Fell, Scafell Pike, Lingmell, Broad Crag, Great End, Glaramara, Castle Crag, Seathwaite Fell (Great Slack), Allan Crags and Brandreth. Eleven of the peaks were gifted to the nation by the FRCC in memory of members killed in WWI, the three others were gifted by their owners in like mind. A member of the congregation at our Easter Sunday Festival Communion was one of a group of three that managed to complete it in 7hrs 57 minutes on Easter Saturday!



BECKERMET NEWS

We all appreciate that we live on the peripheral of the Lake District and without sufficient rainfall we would not have the lakes. However, it is fair to say that we have had more than our fair share of the wet stuff in recent times, with March and the previous months being the wettest period since records began. April is known for its showers and we have already seen plenty of them, causing the wet ground to be even more saturated than normal for this time of the year. Such conditions have a major impact on not only the farming community who have to endure the elements but also for keen gardeners who find the conditions difficult. The wet and windy weather brings other problems with people not wanting to venture out, especially the older members of our community. It is therefore important that we keep a good neighbourly watch on those who may need some company if they are unable to venture out. A simple phone call or a brief visit could make all the difference. Hopefully the weather will soon start to improve, as we could all benefit from a little, or preferably a lot, more sunshine and a lot less rain.

The Easter Sunday service saw us return for the first time this year to St John's Church in the village. During the past three months our twice monthly services had been held in the Reading Rooms due to the unpredictable reliability of the church heating system. The Reading Rooms provided a really good alternative for our services, being much warmer and with the provision of toilets and the use of the kitchen for teas & coffees available before & after each service. We are very grateful to the directors of the Reading Rooms who not only allowed us to use their facilities but wavered the hire charge to support St John's Church. The PCC and those who attended very much appreciate this support given to the church. The Easter Service was well attended by just over thirty members who were all glad to be back in the church, even though it may not have been as cosy as we had all been accustomed to in the Reading Rooms. Please note that now we are back in the church all services will commence at 9.30am

Thanks to the dedicated voluntary work of the small group of C.I.C. directors who oversee the running of the Reading Rooms we now have a first-class facility that is used for many different purposes from quiz & bingo nights, to coffee, cake & chat sessions, a café, art classes, yoga classes, band nights, open mic nights to name but a few. The main aim is to enable everyone who wishes to enjoy an activity to meet like-minded people, both from within the village and the wider community. All events and activities are advertised in the village newsletter, on posters in the village noticeboards and on the Reading Room and Village Facebook pages. If you haven't managed to attend anything as yet I strongly advise you to do so, even if it is only to see the transformation achieved with the help of grants especially from the GDF.

SAINT FOR MAY - St AUGUSTINE

On the 26th of May the Church of England remembers Augustine, who died in 605 as Archbishop of Canterbury. He had been the Prior of a monastery in Rome and had been selected by Pope Gregory the Great to lead a mission to England. There had been some Christians in the country during Roman times,



notably St. Albans, who might appear here next month, but paganism was rife, particularly after the arrival of our friends (not perhaps the right word) from the Continent. Augustine arrived in Thanet in 597 and quickly converted the local King of Kent and his people. He was consecrated Bishop in the same year and established his see at Canterbury, which eventually became the principal church in the Anglican Community.


