## FROM BOOTLE RECTORY

It was certainly many years ago when I was first introduced to the poem by Thomas Hood called 'November.' It goes:

No sun — no moon!  
No morn — no noon — No dawn — no dusk — no proper time of day.  
No warmth, no cheerfulness, no healthful ease, No comfortable feel in  
any member — No shade, no shine, no butterflies, no bees,  
No fruits, no flowers, no leaves, no birds! — November!

Indeed I am sure that is how many of us feel as November arrives and winter draws on and the dark nights are really upon us. I think this is especially so when our summer has been poor as it has been this year.

Yet the end of October and the beginning of November is full of notable events. First there is All Souls and All Saints tide. For All Souls this is where the church and the community can come together and remember those who died and have meant so much to us. I believe this is a valuable opportunity in the church's calendar to acknowledge death, loss, and bereavement. As we all know, death is an inescapable part of human existence, and yet it is undeniably painful when we are confronted by it. There is no time limit to grief, and for many, the death of a special person in their lives can mean the pain of it can last a lifetime. It is often subsumed by our everyday lives but sometimes it catches us unawares. The coming together, the lighting a candle, or putting a stone in a pool of water, reminds us of our loved ones and that they still live on in us. Yet also in our collective remembering, we come together for healing and consolation which can be powerful stuff.

Then for All Saints, we remember with joy and thanksgiving those who have gone before us. People who have left us an example of the way to live in this life now by serving our Lord, not just in prayer, but by serving others.

These services are quickly followed by the Remembrance Service. Again a collective grief in our communities of lives lost in the past wars and the sacrifice of so many to be remembered still. Yet for all our remembering, we still do not seem to be able to escape from humanities plundering into war. The desire for power, and destructive conflict being the only answer to our raging, rather than talking round a table and sharing bread. It is sad. Each year we pray for peace but at this poignant time it seems a vain hope!

Then of course, in the middle, is Bonfire Night. The reason for the event is almost forgotten, the underlying conflict is in the mist of time and

history. It is a time for families, friends and communities to come together to laugh, to share food and to wonder in amazement at the spectacle that lights our November sky.

Perhaps Thomas Hood and Walter del la Mare for that matter were a bit premature in the castigation of November, well the first part at least.

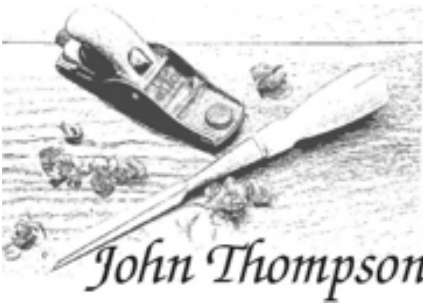

On Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> September at St Cuthbert's Church, Seascale, 12 young people were confirmed by Bishop Peter Ramsden, Honorary Assistant Bishop in Carlisle Diocese. It was a delight and a privilege to share in this special occasion with family and friends of the candidates as well as many churchgoers from across the Mission Community and beyond. It was lovely to have a full

church and all ages present.

Thank you to Bishop Peter for his prayers for the candidates, and for not only coming to conduct the confirmations, but for taking the time to visit prior to the service to meet the candidates and be involved in their preparation for confirmation. It was great to hear something of his adventures in Papua New Guinea where he lived out his calling as bishop for several years.

Confirmation is a significant step in faith for anyone, young or old, as they reaffirm the promises that were made, often on their behalf by parents and godparents, at baptism. As the candidates profess their faith with their own mouths and in their own hearts, they are united with the wider church family. We believe each candidate is known by God and he has called them by name to be his children. The bishop asks the Holy Spirit to come and rest upon each candidate, so that they may be strengthened by the Holy Spirit and receive his gifts, to enable them to live as faithful disciples of Jesus Christ.

We look forward to continuing the journey with these young people in the months and years to come as they grow in their faith and play their part in the Church.

## MAGGIE HOWARTH

A few days ago, Chris Chilton came to my door with an article from the paper about Maggie Howarth, who has just died aged 80.

When I read the name, the memories came flooding back of a wonderful weekend in 1996, organised I believe by Hazel Roscoe, when a group of Gosforth residents had a workshop with Maggie Howarth in the Public Hall, followed up with her advising us in practice at the entrance to Gosforth Car Park.

Yes, that was the weekend when the Pebble Mosaic appeared!



Trailer loads of stones from the beach (permission was given) were brought to the car park, and, under Maggie's guidance, us volunteers hammered them into the prepared surface. The central plaque was made by Maggie in her studio and transported up here. The rest was done by such an enthusiastic band of volunteers. We were regularly 'refreshed' by Margaret Simpson, who lived just opposite next

to 'The Lion and Lamb', who seemed to be continuously bringing over trays of tea and coffee, biscuits and cake. We couldn't have done it without her. It was hard physical work, but so satisfying to do, and we formed such a cohesive happy group, while we worked. Some of us were so enthused we came back home and made a mosaic for ourselves in our gardens afterwards!

Maggie told us the pebble mosaic, just on the opposite side of the road, near the village shop, was done in Victorian times, and ours was to compliment that.



Every time I go up to the village I enjoy seeing the Pebble Mosaic, and the memories it brings back of those happy few days. Does anyone else remember I wonder?

P.S. Apparently Maggie's son is now running the business and currently installing pebble mosaics at Balmoral and Sandringham, commissioned by King Charles, following Maggie's huge success. The article says that she has installed mosaics not just in Whitehaven 's King Street and Green Market, but all over the country - Lancaster, Swindon, Gateshead, Bradford, Rotherham, Bournemouth, Swanage, Dunblane, and Livingston New Town.

**CENTENARY OF FRCC WAR MEMORIAL** – The Memorial was dedicated in June 1924. To commemorate its centenary we will include the hymns and psalm used at its dedication in our Remembrance Sunday service.

**ST OLAF'S PCMC Trustees Meeting** – The October meeting was held at the Inn on 16<sup>th</sup> October. St Olaf's finances continue to improve, with visitor donations in the first 9 months of 2024 equalling those of the full year in 2023. Total outgoings in the 9 month period were £7923, receipts £16211. The surplus goes towards the cost St Olaf's restoration. We are so grateful to our visitors and to residents for their amazing generosity.

Following planning approval from the Lake District National Park in July, the faculty for the restoration of St Olaf's was approved by the Diocese at their recent meeting following a site visit in September. The faculty now awaits the signature of the Diocesan Chancellor.

Other subjects discussed by the trustees were mission and worship, the organ and pilgrimage. Regarding the Old School, the trustees elected to give the Wasdale Forum and other interested local parties until April to finalise plans to acquire the building to convert it for use as public toilets. The trustees made this offer last year to the National Trust and LDNP, both of whom declined. Public toilets have been a prime requirement at Wasdale Head for decades. There is adequate space for toilets to the rear of the building where they could replace the yard and outbuildings, leaving the former schoolroom and porch for an alternative use. Please get in touch if you would like further information.

## ‘Sing to the Lord a new song’

The recent death of the Anglican priest and hymn writer, Timothy Dudley-Smith has made me think again about the importance to me, and the worship of all churches, of ‘Singing the Faith.’ In our Methodist hymn book of that name, there are nine of Dudley-Smith’s hymns. Three of these are also in Mission Praise – nos. 428, 631 and 583.

‘Lord, for the years.....’ (428) is one that I find especially helpful as a prayer of praise and intercession, as it leads our thoughts from narrowly personal concerns to the wider issues of the church and the world. Repetition, rhyme and a very good tune help to make it memorable! Here are some lines of each verse:

1. Lord of the years, we bring our thanks today.
2. Lord, for that word, the word of life that fires us,
3. Lord, for our land in this our generation,
4. Lord, for our world; where men disown and doubt you.....  
Lord of the world, we pray that Christ may reign.
5. Lord, for ourselves; in living power remake us,  
self on the cross and Christ upon the throne,  
past put behind us, for the future take us:  
Lord of our lives, to live for Christ alone.

I hope you may also find them useful too.

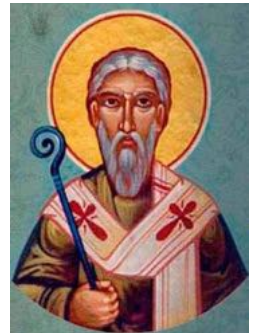

## **SAINT FOR NOVEMBER - St. Clement**

St. Clement, who is remembered on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of November, is one of those people about whom nothing much is known but who is important. He was Bishop of Rome (i.e. Pope) from about 90 AD to about 100 AD. He is thought to have been ordained by Peter and to have known and worked with Paul. One fact that is certain is that he wrote to the church in Corinth to help settle an argument. He is not only remembered by the Church of England on the 23<sup>rd</sup> but also by the Roman Catholics and the Lutherans on that day, and by the Orthodox two days later. He is described as a martyr, but, like everything else about him, details are lacking. However, do remember him.

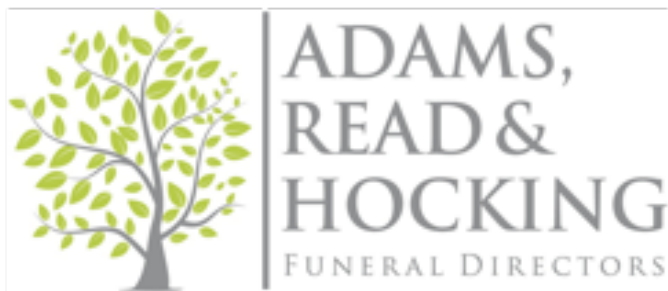

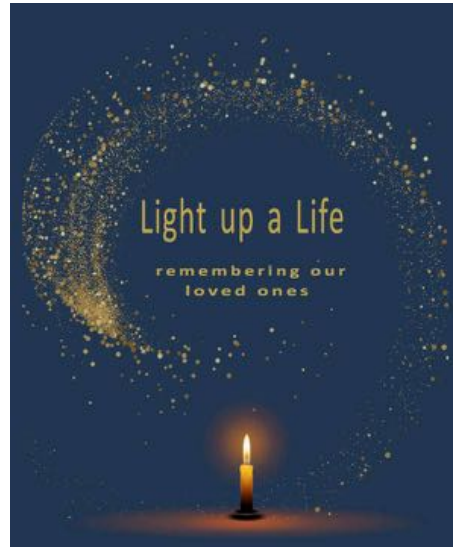
## LIGHT UP A LIFE SERVICE AT GOSFORTH CHURCH Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> December at 2pm
