# **EPOCH CHANGE**

As 2024 comes to a close, it seems almost odd to reflect that just 7 months ago, the United Kingdom had a Conservative government with a large majority and Joe Biden was running for his second term in office as the President of the United States. Now, in what seems to be 'the blink of an eye', our nation has a new Labour Prime Minister with a new direction, and in America, the most powerful person on the planet will soon be a billionaire business man...again! Many people seem to be in shock. It is as if they cannot understand how so much could happen in such a short period of time. To my ears, it has often sounded as if parts of the media are unwilling to accept some aspects of this new world! In Cumbria we look on and wonder about it all. The truth is that, for some time now, the world has been in the midst of what has been called an 'epoch change'.

Why has everything changed in the way that it has? Perhaps the internet is part of it? All the new things that we have been exposed to may have changed us more than we think. Perhaps as a result, we are now less content with life? Perhaps this is why so many people have begun to feel disempowered, overlooked and 'left behind'? I think it is probably quite important to understand some of the feelings involved. Only by doing that can we be sure that we are playing our part in making sure that our communities remain strong, cohesive places where people really do feel welcomed and supported.

But understanding people isn't easy, is it? When we try, we sometimes think we can discern things that may not actually be there. Often, we assume that people will agree with us, only to find they don't. The resulting frustration can lead us to give up. We may get angry, argue or even distance ourselves from other people. Understanding people is surely more about watching and listening than anything else. Pushing big ideas around like a politician, and then expecting people to 'fall in line' simply does not help!... as we now know, this is the recipe for a 'culture war', and they are not much fun are they?

A little while back, I read a quote from Queen Beatrix of the Netherlands, which I think contains an absolutely stunning truth. Apparently, in a Christmas message she once said, 'People see things differently through eyes that have wept'. Maybe all this change has come about because some people's tears have made them see things in a truly different way. Maybe that idea needs to be weighed and understood, and not simply dismissed. We also need to remember that Jesus was born into a time like ours – into the midst of an 'epoch change'. In the Bible we read that he saw it all through human eyes that wept both tears of frustration and

love for us. Through his tears he saw the power of death over people that he loved, as well as over the communities that they belonged to. His watching and listening and crying ultimately took him to Jerusalem and on to the Cross. There he made 'a full, perfect and sufficient sacrifice, oblation and satisfaction for the sins of the whole world'. Take some time to ponder those words. They are not simply religious cant. The tears of Jesus fell on a path that can lead any one of us to eternal life. Tears are powerful – they move people in important ways.

All over the world tears are being shed as this 'epoch change' progresses. This year, as Christmas approaches, we need to remember the displaced, the persecuted, and the refugee. We must remember the disenfranchised and the disillusioned. We need to go on being moved by the sick and the bereaved. We must remember places, where people are surrounded by bombs that fall and buildings that are on fire.

Life-changing tears being cried in all these situations right now. As we remember these things we must remain centred in Christ. 'In Christ' we will be moved – perhaps even to tears - but we will not be confused or lacking in hope. 'In Christ' we will find his strength and courage at work...and that can do immeasurably more than we can ask for or even imagine (Ephesians Ch 3vs20). So, may the light and love of Christ bless you and shine on you as you travel through Advent and Christmas this year.

The last meeting of the Management Committee was held on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> November 2024.

The Committee would like to thank those that helped tidy up the Church building as well as the Churchyard at our Boon Day which took place on 31<sup>st</sup> August. We rely on the support from our local community in keeping St. Mary's looking good, thank you.

The level of 'Giving' coming in to Church is showing a 10% decrease on last years' figures. This is not keeping in line with the rate of inflation. The Committee are looking at ways to encourage an increase in the level of 'Giving' from all.

The fundraising event held on 29th June in Ann & Peter McKenzie's garden raised £578.40 which was a terrific result. The BBQ and raffle, held at the Rectory in September, went as well as could be expected due to the adverse weather conditions. We are pleased to report approximately £180 was raised to go towards the upkeep of our Church.

The Committee are actively seeking a Contractor who could carry out repairs and maintenance to the roof. This is proving to be challenging and we would welcome suggestions of suitable contractors.

We are pleased to report that we are now employing Heather Charalambous as our Playleader for the Tuesday Baby and Toddler Group. The group continues to flourish strongly with new and current members attending.

# SAINT FOR JANUARY - St Aelred of Hexham

If you have been indulging in what P.G. Wodehouse called 'excesses' over the festive period, you might like to consider the life of St. Aelred of Hexham as an antidote. He is remembered on the 12<sup>th</sup> of January as Abbot of Rievaulx Abbey, a Cistercian foundation in Yorkshire. He possibly was educated in Durham and then spent several years in the court of King Donald the 1st of Scotland, rising to the rank



of Master of the Household. He then became a monk at Rievaulx, and rose to become the Abbot. He travelled extensively, including to Rome, and wrote important spiritual works. He died in the winter of 1166-7 and is remembered for his piety and kindness.

## **Autumn Term with Gosforth Methodists and Phoenix Praise**

It's been an exciting term once again for us in Gosforth (sorry, but after 35 years of teaching I reckon I will always think of time 'in terms of terms'!). Evening services have continued to be vibrant and well attended, with plenty of interaction and only occasional anarchy.

For those who are still unsure about what goes on in St Mary's Room on Sunday evenings, on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of each month Gosforth Methodists host a service at 6.30pm. On 4th Sundays Phoenix host a hybrid (live and Zoomed) service at 7pm. All are welcome at both, and the style of worship is broadly similar: an informal and relaxed service where questions, comments and extempore prayer 'from the floor' are welcomed; on 3rd Sundays the service is specifically styled 'all-age' and we often have readings and sometimes sketches brought to us by the young people.


