

EXPRESSIONS

A while ago, I was out walking with my family in the South Lakes. All of a sudden, the dog barked, and bolted towards a line of mature Lawson Cypress trees that were planted along the edge of a piece of Forestry Commission woodland. He was in hot pursuit of a grey squirrel which skipped up the tree, and disappeared into the thicket of Lawson branches. When we caught up, we found the dog jumping up and down helplessly, barking up a tree with no squirrel in it....and, as we watched, a light went on simultaneously in all of our heads.... 'so that is where the expression comes from!'

Expressions form a wonderfully rich part of our, equally wonderful, language, don't they? When I worked as a wood cutter, we would occasionally find old saw pits in the woods, where my more elderly work mates would enjoy telling me stories about 'top-dogs' and 'under-dogs', and what a real day's work must have felt like in the 'good old days'.

There are so many expressions aren't there? My Dad used to enjoy using them to put me back in my place....he would say: 'Philip....it's one thing to be as cool as a cucumber....but quite another to be as green!'.....and, as I groaned, and muttered something teenage back, he would stomp off, usually saying something like: 'You're so sharp you'll cut yourself.'

For most of us, life can often seem like one long struggle to express ourselves and to be properly understood. The things we say are often misinterpreted, and when this happens – as we all know – we have to make a choice as to whether we are going to 'ride the storm out', or 'weigh anchor' and 'sail into the sunset'....or indeed, whether we are going to 'take it on the chin' and 'eat some humble pie.' I used to work with a man who was habitually in trouble with his partner. Each day, he would mount his bike at four o'clock, and his parting shot would often be 'tongue pie and chicken's lips for tea then'... as he made his way home to his loved ones.

By the time this copy of the magazine is out, we will be well on our way through Lent and heading towards Holy Week and the excitement of Easter Day. And of course, this pilgrimage is all about facing ourselves, and admitting that sometimes we fail to understand each other; we say things that are misconstrued, we don't forgive one another very easily... and perhaps worst of all...because of the frustration of all this...when we are in private, we often lash out at the failings of other people as if we were perfect! It's not very nice really. But there is a way out for the brave...

In the biblical story of the woman caught in adultery, a group of men turn on a woman who has been 'caught in the act'. They decide to put the woman to death by stoning her, and - famously - Jesus steps in to save her... both from the men... and from the destructive patterns of behaviour that have governed her life up until that point. He disarms her accusers by forcing them to face themselves, and answer the question: 'Are they perfect?' Then Jesus sets the woman free. He makes it clear to her, that, what she has done can never be right, and must be left completely behind, if she is to find 'release' and a new life. He then writes in the sand as he does all this.

I like to think that the expression 'to draw a line in the sand' comes from Jesus' act on that day. Why?... well, it helps me to remember that this is how God deals with my mistakes... and heaven knows I make plenty... so many in fact, that I feel very confident, that I could repeat most of them almost without trying! For me, Lent is such a good time to watch Jesus as he stoops to draw lines in the sand for us all.

The last meeting of the Management Committee was held on Tuesday 4th March, 2025 at which it was reported that finances are worrying. The level of 'Giving' coming in to Church is showing a 10% decrease on last years' figures. Unfortunately, this is not keeping in line with the rate of inflation. If you are in the position of being able to increase your regular giving, or indeed if you would like to make any donations, it would be extremely helpful and we would be very grateful. The Churchyard wall on the Denton Park side has been re-built and the bamboo re-moved. We also had to deal with a fallen tree after the recent storms and would like to thank all those who helped complete this promptly and safely. The Committee are currently looking for Contractors who could carry out repairs and maintenance to the roof. This is proving to be challenging and we would welcome suggestions of suitable contractors.

We have also been making alterations to St Mary's Rooms. These have taken longer than anticipated and thank all for your patience. We hope to have these completed sometime in the Summer.



St Olafs, Wasdale Head faith in the fells

APRIL SERVICES AT ST OLAF'S

PALM SUNDAY 13th April – 11am The Road to Calvary – the story of Christ's Passion from Palm Sunday until Good Friday in words and music.

EASTER SUNDAY 20th April – Festival Holy Communion SUNDAY 27th April – 11am Morning Worship

Sundays 6th and 20th April – 9.30am service at Nether Wasdale church.

It's great to have three services at St Olaf's in April. Carolyn is leading our special **Palm Sunday** service when in words and music the story of Christ's Passion unfolds. This is backed up with 14 Station of the Cross – the Jenny Hawke art installation which will be on display at St Olaf's for the weeks either side of Easter. On **Easter Sunday** we welcome Rev Rachel Cunliffe who will be leading our Festival Holy Communion. We complete the 'trinity' with Rosalind leading us in Morning Worship on the **Sunday 27th April**.

NUMBERS UP – The first three months of 2025 have seen better weather than last year, but the difference doesn't quite explain why St Olaf's is experiencing such a remarkable increase in visitor numbers – up 160% at the date this magazine went to press. It is good that 'quiet season' visitor numbers are growing in the Lake District, particularly if it eases summer pressures a little.

RESTORATION – We are closing in on the restoration funding target (£210,000) and at the time of writing there is a chance that we can reach it by the end of May – in time to authorise the work to begin in the late summer. Otherwise it will go ahead in the spring of 2026. Growing visitor numbers have been a huge help and we are bowled over by the generosity of so many. We are so grateful.

PANEL DISPLAYS – we now have a series of different panel displays to span the year, designed to inspire and inform as part of our faith in the fells mission. In March we invested in a set of larger A2 panel holders (replacing A3 panels), to enhance the displays. They have been devised and designed by Carolyn and beautifully printed by Pauline Bailey at Barneys Print Shop. The displays feature up to 10-14 panels spread along the north and south walls.

To further improve our village last year a group of enthusiastic volunteers banded together to, not only plant more bulbs, but also work many hours tidying up various areas of the village. All this work was undertaken to enter Cumbria-in-Bloom and all their efforts paid off as they gained a silver award whilst improving the appearance of the community we live in. This year they are once again entering and hoping to go one further by gaining gold. With this in mind, they are once again looking to get as many, if not more, volunteers to assist in their strive towards gold. These cinema evenings are free for all to attend so why not come along and enjoy a free night out and have a drink, as the bar will be open to purchase refreshments, including alcohol.


Open Mic Night – 2nd Wednesday of each month.

For local musicians to come along and play for enjoyment and entertain those who attend. Free entry and bar open.



Our girls in Key Stage 2 took part in the Girls Biggest Football Event. They gathered out on the school field and their afternoon began by holding a minutes silence in memory of 10 year old Poppy Atkinson from Kendal, who tragically lost her life recently, playing the sport she loved.

Year 6 travelled to Muncaster Castle for a Copeland schools Orienteering event. They

com-pleted three different courses and had the opportunity to enjoy the gardens and play area.

The theme for this year's Science Week was Change & Adapt. The children watched a live lesson on CBBC to find out what it takes to become an astronaut. The effects of space on our bones was explained, followed by how astronauts manage food and hydration - exploring the challenges of living in space. By the end of the week, they had

completed an 'astronaut training plan,' preparing them for life in space and inspiring them to blast off into the world of science and space exploration.

You may be aware that during the busier summer months, the LDNPA, in conjunction with Wasdale Action Group, have arranged for a shuttle bus to run around Wasdale in an attempt to ease the traffic congestion that occurs in Wasdale. SAINT FOR APRIL - St Alphege



On the 19th of April the Church of England remembers St. Alphege, which is a simplified version of his real Anglo-Saxon name. He was born in 953 and followed a holy life, becoming Bishop of Winchester and then Archbishop of Canterbury. In 1011 he was captured by the Vikings. He was offered freedom in return for a ransom payment. He refused this and was then killed by the Vikings in the following year. He was a popular saint with a number of churches dedicated in his name.

Thomas Becket, later that century, prayed to him shortly before his own martyrdom.


