FROM BECKERMET VICARAGE

Have you ever been up in a hot air balloon? I have not, but I do like to see them in the sky and wonder what perspective of the earth they get from the basket – it must be spectacular!

At the end of May, the Church celebrates Ascension Day. Marking the time when Jesus, having risen from the dead and made many appearances to his



disciples, leaves earth to go and be with his Father in heaven. In the Bible, Jesus is depicted as being lifted up from earth, a cloud taking him out of sight, an upward movement which left the disciples staring into the sky.

We often think of heaven being above earth, God looking down on us from above. In April 1961, the Soviet Cosmonaut and Airforce test pilot Yuri Gagarin became the first man to ever go into space. It was claimed that whilst he was up there, he said, "I see no God up here." Though these words are generally considered atheist Soviet propaganda rather than Gagarin's, it is interesting that the expectation was that God would be visible as a physical being, to be found in the skies above the earth, the heavens. Where is God? And where did Jesus ascend to?

Christians believe that God is with us on earth as well as being in heaven. Jesus came as God in human form to live among us on earth, and when he had ascended to be with his Father God in heaven, God the Holy Spirit came to dwell in us. Heaven is not a place as we conceive place, it is beyond our comprehension, and all we truly know is that it is a place where God dwells and where Jesus reigns as Lord and King. We might not be able to find God sitting on a cloud in the skies above us, at least not in any physical form we might sometimes picture in our heads, but he is present on earth and in heaven, and he sees and knows all that is happening.

Jesus having gone to be with the Father in heaven, has brought a unique perspective to God of what it is like to live on earth. We have a God who through Jesus Christ knows our joys and delights, our struggles and sufferings, as human beings. He is perfectly positioned to intercede to God the Father in prayer for us, as we pray to him through the Holy Spirit. In heaven, seated at the right hand of the Father, Jesus hears our prayers, he feels our prayers, and he joins us in praying our prayers.

When you next see a hot air balloon slowly moving across the sky above you, let it remind you that Jesus our Lord and King is seated high above the earth watching over us each and every day. He sees, he knows, he loves, and he cares.

FROM THE EDITOR

Firstly, I want to thank everyone who came along to my Easter Celebration, and also those who weren't able to come but made a contribution towards it. I think everyone enjoyed the chat and we raised a total of £515 for the upkeep of St Mary's Church and Churchyard.

Having said that, I just wanted to share with you my concerns about the churchyard. As you will know, it looks amazing during the Spring as it is full of snowdrops, followed by crocus and then daffodils. We start cutting the grass every two weeks in April, but only cut the areas that are frequently visited by family members, and this goes on until the end of October. The other areas are cut twice a year only.

At one time we had enough burials during the year for the fees to pay for the cutting of the grass, but nowadays most people opt for cremation so we only have two or three burials a year. The churchyard is the burial ground not only for Gosforth but also half of Seascale and for all denominations. We receive small contributions from Gosforth and Seascale Parish Councils and Seascale Church but not nearly enough to cover the costs, so St Mary's has to cover the rest. Last year each cut cost us £222 with the 2 big cuts costing £420, making a total of £3504 for the year.

The first cut this year costs £234. On 31st March we had £183 in our Churchyard account!

Hope to see you on the day – everyone welcome!






TRUSTEES MEETING - The bi-annual meeting of the Trustees of St Olaf's PCMC was held at the Inn on Wednesday 2nd April. The Treasurer, Carolyn, had promptly produced accounts for the 3 months ending 31st March. These showed a healthy surplus, which has now been transferred to the restoration fund. The other matters discussed at the meeting concerned the tender for the restoration work and two potential timescales for it to be carried out - this autumn or next spring. In either case it is expected to take 12 weeks. The timing will depend on when the remaining funds are secured, but we are close enough to be sure it will be one or the other! We've waited long enough.

The meeting was the 3rd anniversary of St Olaf's PCMC becoming a Registered Charity, requiring the re-election of Trustees: Jo Balmer, Tim Brooks, Keith Amey, Rosalind Amey (Secretary), Carolyn Foulerton (Treasurer), Andrew Lopez, Angie McGill, Heather Naylor Lopez, and Hugh Foulerton (Chair). We are able to elect three further trustees, and these will be sought to fill our skills gaps - one is public relations/ promotion/marketing and anyone reading this who feels they could help fill this particular gap should get in touch with us.

Faith in the fells

MAY GOSLING

Has anyone heard of the 1st May being called 'May Gosling'? My father, born and bred in Ravenglass, always referred to it as May Gosling but, as I hadn't heard of anyone else calling it that, I decided to 'google' it. Apparently, it was a northern custom, similar to 1st April being called 'April Fool'.

'A May gosling on the 1st of May is made with as much eagerness in the North of England, as an April fool, on the 1st April'. (Gentleman's magazine of 1791)

In Nicholas Rhea's diary, from the early 1920's (The Rhea family built and lived at Gatehouse, Eskdale, now the Outward Bound School) a blog site records:


"One very popular May Day game when I was a child in Eskdale was May Gosling. It was rather like April Fool pranks played on April 1st because children played jokes upon each other. Anyone who fell victim was known as a May Gosling. Just like April Fool jokes, the pranks had to be perpetrated before noon."

If the pranks were not completed by 12 noon, then you would be taunted with:

"May Gosling's dead and gone, You're the fool for thinking on."

Alan Titchmarsh, gardener and TV celebrity, also commented in 2012:

"As a Yorkshire lad, born on 2nd May, my Yorkshire grandmother would ask me 'Have you been christened a May Gosling?' I wondered what she meant then I discovered there had been a Northern custom, akin to April Fooling, which took place on 1st May. Tricks were played and successful perpetrators would cry 'May Gosling!', presumably implying the victim was as silly as a young goose. The response would be: 'May Goslings past and gone. You're a fool for making me one!'

The May Festival

Plaiting the Maypole originally took place on May Day, the 1st of May, when the children danced around an old oak tree to which ribbons had been attached, but in 1897 a Maypole was erected in its place to commemorate the 60-year reign of Queen Victoria. The children from Netherwasdale School spent the weeks before May Day practicing their dancing and singing in preparation for this very special day. Not only was the dancing important but also the excellent tea provided by Mrs Smith from the Strands Hotel.

This year the children from Gosforth School will be busy practicing their dancing as they now have their own maypole, presented to them by the May Festival Committee. There will also be an excellent tea provided by the committee with many lovely home-baked cakes.

You will see from the flyer on page 19 that the afternoon starts with a children's fancy dress and posy competition, followed by maypole dancing and sports. Music will be provided by Whitehaven Town Band and their will be various stalls.

The festivities start at 2.00pm – an hour later than usual – so we hope many of you will join us for a family fun day and a chance to meet up with old friends and make some new ones!

SAINTS FOR MAY - JOHN AND CHARLES WESLEY (not officially saints)



On the 24th of May Common Worship remembers two brothers, both of them Church of England clergymen. They are John and Charles Wesley, who lived in the Eighteenth Century. John was a noted

Evangelist and was well known for travelling all over the country. His methodical way of worship was influential. Charles provided the soundtrack, as it were, writing many hymns, including 'And can it be'; 'Love Divine all loves excelling'; 'O for a thousand tongues to sing'; 'Christ the Lord is risen today';'Hark the Herald Angels sing;', and 'Lo, He comes with clouds descending'. There are many more - perhaps over six thousand! So, whilst not saints, in technical terms, they are remembered today by many.


Beckermet Village Lottery






