FROM THE RECTORY

Grumblers Anonymous

Have you ever noticed how easy it is to slip into phases of grumbling!? Here at the Rectory, they are quite frequent. I guess, sometimes, things can get on top of you, and then nothing is quite right! You find yourself saying things like... 'When will that parcel arrive?'... and, 'I couldn't believe the traffic?... and, 'Have you seen what XYZ said in Parliament yesterday?'... and, 'Nothing's quite like it used to be'...etc, etc.

François-Xavier Nguyễn Văn Thuận was a Vietnamese man, who lived between 1928 and 2002. His life spanned a period in which the world changed more than it had in the previous 1000 years. This man, was ordained as a Roman Catholic Priest in 1953. In 1967, he became the Bishop of Hha Trang, and then in 1975, he went on to be enthroned as the Archbishop of Siagon, six days before it fell to the North Vietnamese army. Shortly after this, Archbishop Nguyễn Văn Thuận was detained in a Vietnamese 're-education camp' for 13 years. Of these 13 years, 9 were spent in solitary confinement. During his time in prison and solitary confinement, Văn Thuận wrote:

'I am happy here, in this cell, where white mushrooms are growing on my sleeping mat,

because You are here with me... because You want me to live with You. I have spoken much in my lifetime: now I speak no more. It's your turn to speak to me, Jesus: I am listening to you.'

The result of all this listening was an extraordinary series of 1001 thoughts, smuggled out of prison on small bits of paper, written for the benefit of his flock. Today they can be read in a book called 'The Road to Hope'. It is a book that has inspired many. Here are a few of the conclusions Văn Thuận came to at the end of his long listening to Jesus alone.

He wrote:

- I will hold firmly to one secret: prayer.
- I will seek the peace the world cannot give.
- I will carry out a revolution by renewal in the Holy Spirit.
- I will speak one language and wear one uniform: love.

... And then...interestingly...

'The habit of criticizing others is one of the greatest obstacles to growth in the spiritual life.

Blaming others serves only to irritate them, and cultivates bitterness in your own heart.'

That is what Văn Thuận discovered from Jesus in his cell... that grumbling is really bad for a person - and this, from a man who had more reason to be down at heart than many!

People have always grumbled away, usually anonymously, and more often than not against their leaders. At this point in history, we should spare a thought for our political leaders... and for our new spiritual leaders – for our Bishop, and for the Pope. To lead in these days of mass social media is a daunting undertaking! Jesus said that if we have a complaint, we should go straight to the person concerned. A grumbling spirit needs to be cast out by unconditional repentance before God, by the acceptance of Jesus' forgiveness, and by the heartfelt request to God, that he might fill us afresh with his amazing, sacrificial love.

Why would we do this? Well, love and grumbling can't exist together, and it's much better for a person's health if love wins the day. People like Archbishop François-Xavier Nguyễn Văn Thuận amaze me. Have you noticed that it is often those with the best reason to grumble that, in the end, hardly ever do?








Beckermet Village Lottery




