

# **Treasure Islands**

To a child, every island is a treasure island. That's what the writer P.D. James is reported to have written. What a shame we 'grow up', and lose our 'sense of excitement' so easily!

I expect that I am not alone in liking islands. In my early twenties, for one summer, I went to live in the Isles of Scilly. I'll never forget getting there. A helicopter ride, out over Lands End (as it is now called), across the sea to St Mary's... and then a walk down to the quay, where we caught a boat, across the Sound, to Tresco. The sun came out as we sailed. I remember getting vertigo as I looked over the side of the little fishing boat. The water was so clear, it was three dimensional. When we arrived, there were strange metallic flowers from Southern Africa everywhere, and palm trees. There was the famous garden – a steamy jungle full of sandy paths, ship's figureheads and strange statues. The white sand sparkled everywhere. The sea was 'blue' blue. To a child, every island really is a treasure island! Of course, the UK is a collection of many islands – and it is full of treasure!

Perhaps it is true to say that islands contain other things alongside their 'treasures'. They have people and communities of a particular type. They are stereotypically rugged, determined, and self-sufficient, giving rise to a resilience that can be a wonderful thing.... especially in times of natural disaster, or hostile attack. But again, the stereotypes say, 'Be careful!' Attempts at 'unpicking' an island mentality can be risky. There is often more to an island than treasure! Cultures matter. Our culture is not to be dismissed - it will fight for its life. No, our culture is to be cherished... but we must also realise that an 'island culture' can also be terribly blind, can't it? Strangely, when we look 'inwards', we don't find peace, we find ever smaller islands, and new disagreements. Conversely, if we look outwards, we find a more accurate way of seeing and understanding our lives; often, we suddenly realise that, by comparison with some people and places, we are 'blessed'. On our island, there is 'treasure' everywhere.

So, the antidote to the 'dark side' of our 'island mentality', is not to pretend it does not exist... surely, it is to 'name' it, and then to allow our concern for other 'places' and 'cultures' to grow. We have to try not to feel threatened. We have to look across 'the straights', and be excited enough to 'explore'. Each year, the Harvest Season gives us that chance. On a local level, we can engage with other people's lives. We can go to a School Harvest Service, a Harvest Festival, or a Harvest Supper. We can meet new people, and rediscover our place in our very

special community. Further afield, we can think again about far off places, where people struggle with life in ways that would never occur to us... in ways that we would find simply unacceptable... and we can do something about it! Year by year people like you and me from the churches of the Diocese of Carlisle send thousands of pounds to help fight rural poverty in places that have little or no treasure of their own. These days, their relative poverty is often caused by climate change that we, in the West, have done most to cause. It is good to look 'overseas', from the stability of our 'treasure island', and 'see' our blessing for what it is... because facing this 'truth' makes us want to share. This year, the Bishop of Carlisle's 2025 Harvest Appeal gives us another chance to 'make a difference' in vulnerable places. Please look out for the posters and the opportunities to give that will emerge for us all.

Our world is full of 'islands'. Many seem to be turning 'inwards' at the moment. The antidote to this is surely a spirit of exploration and understanding... not fear. Christians have always loved to say, 'In Christ... all things can be made new.' (2Cor Ch5 vs 17). During the Harvest season, we praise God for that truth... and we humble ourselves, as we pray that he will 'do it again'... that he will go on transforming things, not just on our island, but right across this world that he loves.



# St Olaf's Wasdale Head faith in the fells

### **NOVEMBER SERVICES AT ST OLAF'S**

Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> November <u>10.45am</u> – **WASDALE'S REMEMBRANCE SERVICE** Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> November 11am – **Morning Worship** 

All our services are followed by refreshments in the Wasdale Head Inn.

Services at Nether Wasdale are at 9.30am on Sundays 2<sup>nd</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup> November.

**HARVEST OFFERING** – Following our well attended Harvest Thanksgiving we were able to make donations to North Lakes Foodbank in Egremont of £300, plus tinned food to the value of approximately £80. Thanks to those who gave.

**REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY** – the Act of Remembrance starts by the Memorial in St Olaf's churchyard at <u>10.45am</u>. Trumpeter Tony Gagg will sound the 'Last Post' to start the 2 minutes silence, and the 'Reveille' to end it. Prior to the silence, we will read the Roll Call of those who were killed in the two World Wars. WW1 claimed the lives of six young Wasdale men and twenty-one Fell & Rock Climbing Club Members, WW2 claimed a further twelve FRCC members and eight airmen whose planes crashed on the Wasdale fells. **Let us never forget them**. A short Service of Remembrance follows in St Olaf's.

There is also an Act of Remembrance beside the FRCC plaque on the summit of Great Gable. Given quiet conditions, or a favouable wind direction, we hope the call of the trumpet may reach up to those on Gable.

**ST OLAF'S PCMC Trustees Meeting** – the October meeting was held at the Inn on 15<sup>th</sup> October, all trustees were present except one due to illness. It was a meeting where no decisions needed to be made, so was a progress report on St Olaf's strengthening financial position, steady growth in attendance at services and in all aspects of its operations. Tenders have been issued to contractors for the restoration, and are due to be submitted in November.

# **NEWS FROM BECKERMET SCHOOL**





# GOSFORTH PUBLIC HALL REFURBISHMENT PROJECT

Gosforth Parish Council has been successful in being granted funding to refurbish the listed building part of the Public Hall that houses the Library, the Kitchen and the Supper Room. Roland Hill is the Contractor undertaking the refurbishment which started October 6<sup>th</sup>. Most of the work will be completed by 31<sup>st</sup> March 2026 with lime render being undertaken by end June 2026. You may have noticed the Contractor on site with establishment of a fenced area and storage containers.

In October, the main work involved setting up the site, storing the remaining contents of the library, kitchen, supper room and store rooms, erecting scaffolding and stripping out the old redundant equipment. This will continue during November, old plaster will be removed, roof repairs will start and internal modification will begin.

The Public Hall remains open with entry via the rear accessible door. While there is no parking during the refurbishment, pedestrian access is on the right hand side of the Hall. If you wish to book the Hall, please email GPHbooking@gmail.com.

# **WEST LAKELAND ROTARY CLUB**

One of our lady members has been working tirelessly these last 2 years seeking grant funding for the refurbishment of the public footpath that runs from Holmrook via St Paul's Church, to Irton Hall. Grants totalling over £16,000 from the GDF South Copeland Community Fund, the Jeffrey Bond Memorial Fund, and the Geoffrey Blake Architectural Heritage Fund,



and a contribution from our own charity fund, have allowed complete renovation of the main section, from Holmrook to St Paul's Church as well as the provision of detailed information boards to be completed and installed shortly.

Very recently this member applied for another grant, this time from the South Cumberland Community Panel, to tackle the remaining section via Haggs Wood to Irton Hall. At a meeting of the Panel at Drigg in September, she was delighted to be awarded with a grant of £4000 to allow her to order the completion of the work.

This remaining section has an interesting history, and it's all described in a book, 'A Most High Handed Proceeding' by local solicitor and historian Paul Pharaoh, giving a detailed and entertaining account of the long legal dispute, lasting from 1897 to 1907, about Rights of Way between local Irton residents and the then owners of Irton Hall, the Brocklebank shipping magnates. The locals eventually won! Well worth a read! And also well worth the walk.



# SAINT FOR NOVEMBER - ST MARGARET



Saint Margaret of Scotland, who died in 1093, is remembered by the Church of England on the 16<sup>th</sup> of November as a philanthropist and reformer. She was Queen of Alba, as the consort of King Malcolm III. She did many charitable works including the establishment of a ferry across the Firth of Forth to carry Pilgrim's to St. Andrews.

It is the names of South and North Queensferry which remain as her memorial today.
